Teriyaki Stix is celebrating its 15-year anniversary by adding new menu options to its 22-plus locations. The Salt Lake City-based Japanese fast food chain was founded by brothers Mike and Rick Clayton, both Brigham Young University alumni.

The new side options include chicken satay, edamame, spring rolls and pot stickers. Teriyaki Stix is also offering veggies, such as zucchini, carrots, broccoli and squash, that can be added to chicken bowls, as well as a veggie-only bowl.
